

# Managing Pet Hair on Clothing

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CHEAT SHEET

## BEST & WORST FABRICS

✓ **Best:** Polyester, Nylon, Silk, Leather and tight weaves like denim

✗ **Worst:** Wool, Fleece, Cotton Knits, and looser weaves like linen

## GETTING PET HAIR OFF CLOTHES

### **Rubber Glove Trick**

Lightly dampen a rubber glove and sweep it over your clothes. Hair clings to the glove like magic!

### **Sticky Tape Hack**

Wrap tape (sticky side out) around your hand and pat down your clothes for a quick fix in a pinch.

### **Dryer Before Washing**

Toss clothes in the dryer with a dryer sheet or wool dryer balls for 10 minutes to loosen hair before washing.

### **Add Vinegar to the Wash**

Pour ½ cup of white vinegar into your washing machine's rinse cycle. It helps relax fabric and release hair.

### **Don't Overload the Washer**

Give clothes room to move—this helps shake hair loose instead of trapping it.

### **Dryer Sheet Finish**

Dry clothes with an anti-static sheet like Bounce Pet Hair Guard to reduce cling and remove leftover fuzz.

## TIPS FOR LESS HAIR IN THE FIRST PLACE

### **Brush Your Pet Often**

Less loose hair = less stuck to you. Try the FURminator or a slicker brush for maximum results.

### **Use Anti-Static Spray**

Pet hair sticks less to clothing when there's less static. Use pet-safe spray or make your own:

#### **DIY Spray:**

1 cup water + 2 tbsp fabric softener (optional: pet-safe essential oil like lavender). Mist lightly and let dry.

### **Rotate "Pet Clothes"**

Wear designated clothes at home. Change before you leave to avoid carrying fur with you.
